Peace, Conflict, and Sustainable Change

Much has been said about how best to resolve conflict, start
new programs, or initiate change. Yet how does one do this in a
way that is continuous and long lasting? This course will use

psychological research about change, provide service to
communities affected by conflict, and learn about models of
peace building that have taken root within the divided island of
